n CLINICAL TRAINING

The UConn School of Nursing has a growing network of over 300 clinical training partners across Connecticut, and many others across the nation. The School is affiliated with more than 60 health care agencies located within a 75-mile radius of the Storrs campus.

The UConn simulation education program is at the forefront of simulation technology and education practices. The School of Nursing maintains a high-tech Clinical Simulation Learning Center, where over a dozen simulation manikins mimic physiological functions and represent diverse populations, ethnic backgrounds, and life stages.

Nearly all faculty members are either active in nursing practice, provide direct patient care, participate in service events, or participate in or lead a national professional organization.
