REASON FOR POLICY

Graduate courses require that students must earn a passing grade of B (83%) or higher. In graduate courses with combined didactic and lab the student is required to earn a grade of 83% or higher in each component of the class to pass. Clarification is needed to address occurrences when one of the course components does not meet the minimum threshold.

PURPOSE

To ensure that students successfully pass all components in courses when the course includes combined class and simulation/lab.

APPLIES TO

Faculty teaching in graduate courses that combine class, lab and simulation.

DEFINITIONS

Course components refer to the section of a given class, for example, didactic (lectures), clinical (practicum), or simulation and lab.

POLICY STATEMENT

Students must earn a passing grade of B (83%) or higher in in each course component (didactic, lab, and simulation. Failure (<83%) in any one area will mean failure in the course, regardless of the overall grade.

ENFORCEMENT

Violations of this policy may result in appropriate disciplinary measures in accordance with University By-Laws, General Rules of Conduct for All University Employees, and applicable collective bargaining agreements.

PROCEDURES

Failure (<83%) in either Component A (class) or Component B (lab/simulation) will mean the student receives the failing component grade as the earned grade for the course, regardless of the overall grade (e.g., if student earns a grade of 83 or better in Component A but earns an 79 Component B, the student will receive the grade of 79 earned and not pass the course). The student is allowed to repeat a nursing once per School of Nursing program.
